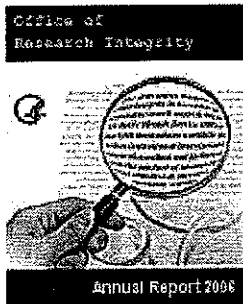

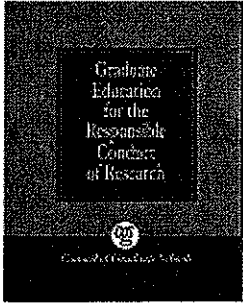
Certification Program for IACUC Professionals



