California Laws Pertaining to Human Research

CA Family Code

- Minor Consent (<u>Sections 6920-6929</u>): Describes when minors (children) may consent for themselves.
- Emancipated Minors (Sections <u>7000-7002</u>; <u>7050-7052</u>; <u>7120-7123</u>): Defines an emancipated minor and rights of emancipated minors.

CA Health and Safety Code

- **Protection of Human Subjects in Medical Experimentation Act** (<u>Sections 24170–</u> <u>24179.5</u>): Describes the informed consent process and requires that the "experimental subject's bill of rights" be provided to all research subjects in medical experiments.
- Experimental Use of Drugs and Consent for Minors Provision (<u>Sections 111515–</u> <u>111545</u>): Minor consent is required prior to administering an experimental drug. Parental or legal guardian consent (permission) is required and minor consent (assent) is required for children 7 years of age or older.
- Surrogate Decision Maker (Section 24178): With respect to medical experiments that relate to the cognitive impairment, lack of capacity, or serious or life-threatening diseases and conditions of adult research participants, investigators may obtain surrogate informed consent following a specific hierarchy for nonemergency and emergency room environments.
- Mandatory Reporting of Sexually Transmitted Disease (<u>Section 120500 -120605</u>): Describes the requirements for reporting sexually transmitted disease to CA Department of Health.

CA Education Code

• Parental Consent for Children to Participate in Research (<u>Section 51513</u>): For K-12 students - tests, questionnaires, surveys, or examinations containing any questions about the pupil's or the pupil's family's personal beliefs or practices in sex, family life, morality, and religion require written parental consent (permission).

CA Penal Code

- Mandatory Reporting of Child Abuse or Neglect (Section 11164 -11174.3) Identifies who is a "mandated reporter" required to report known or reasonably suspected child abuse or neglect.
- Prisoners in Biomedical and Behavioral Research (<u>Section 3500 3523</u>) Describes the requirements for biomedical and behavioral research conducted in CA prisons.

CA Welfare and Institutions Code

• Elder Abuse and Dependent Adult Civil Protection Act (<u>Section 15600 - 15637</u>) Describes the requirements for reporting harm and neglect to elder or dependent adults.

CA Civil Code

• **HIPAA Research Authorization** (<u>Section 56.11(b)</u>) Describes the requirement for a separate HIPAA authorization form.
