ALOHA UPDATE: PEDIATRICS® 2019

- Distinguish seizures from non-seizure paroxysmal events and manage most patients in the primary care setting.
- Differentiate between aeroallergens that are amenable to environmental control and those that are not.
- Vigilantly monitor ex-preemies through the school age years for neurodevelopmental outcomes of prematurity.

The overall learning need identified for this conference is for practical, evidence-based medicine that can be applied in the clinical setting.
